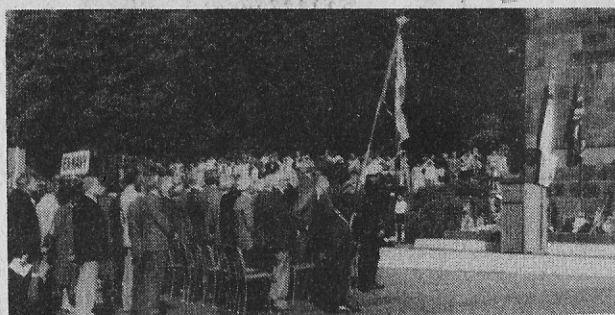

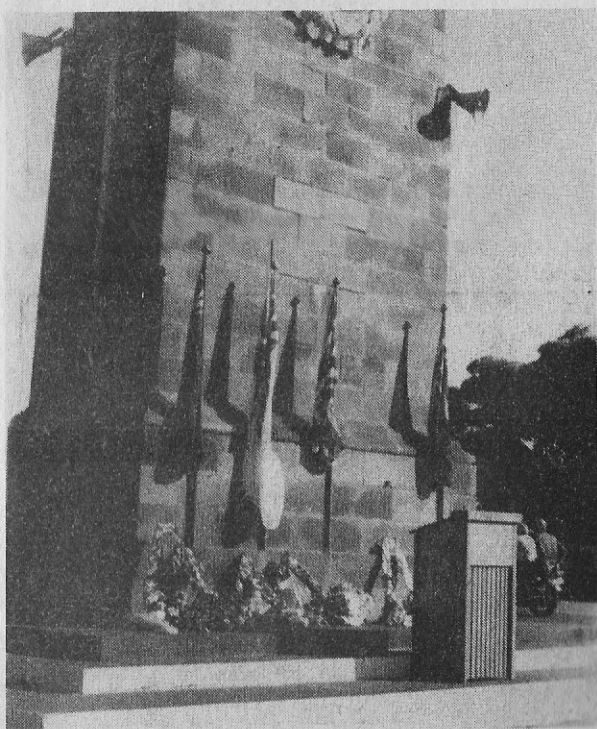

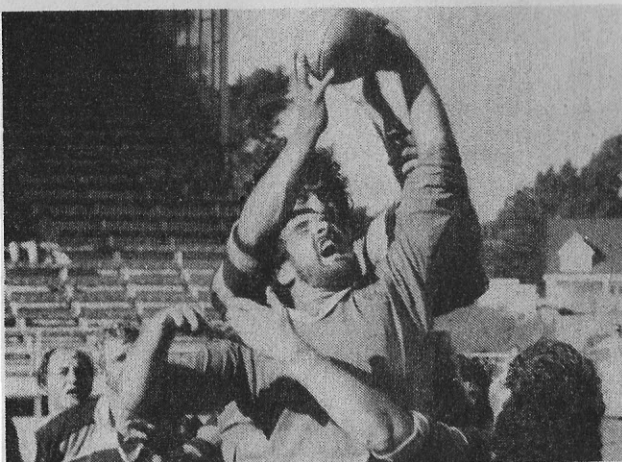

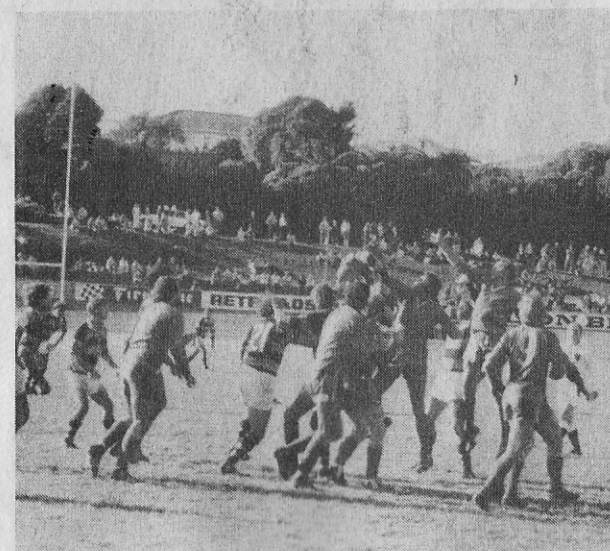

The Annual Cardiff Concert was held on several nights during the last few weeks of April.

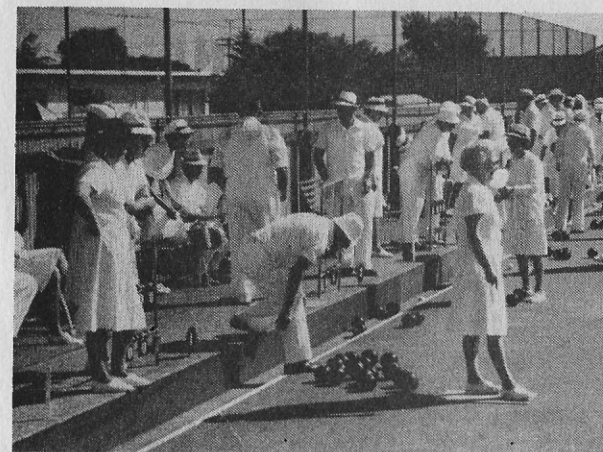

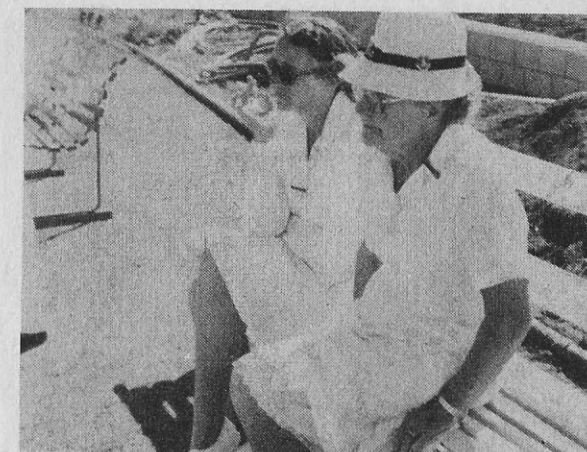

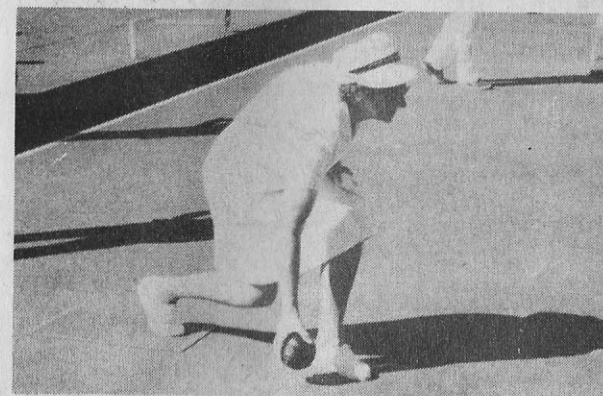

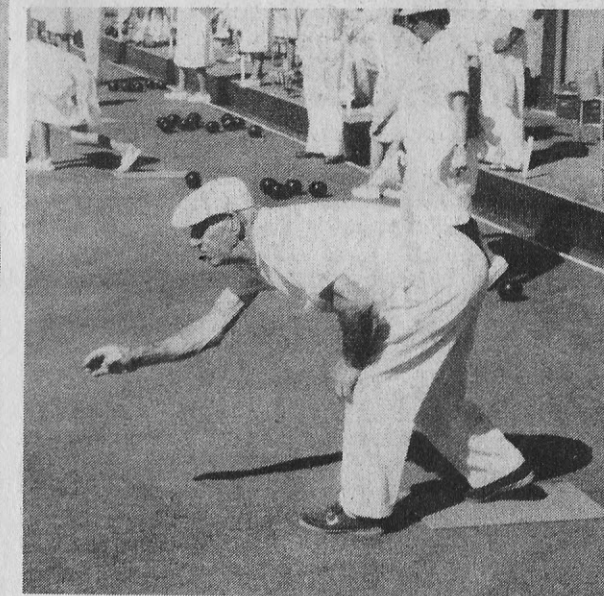

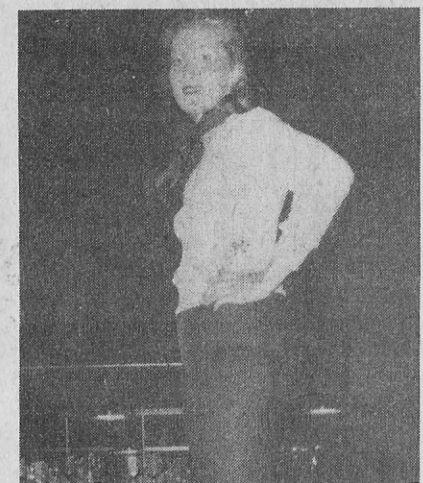
WINTER FASHIONS

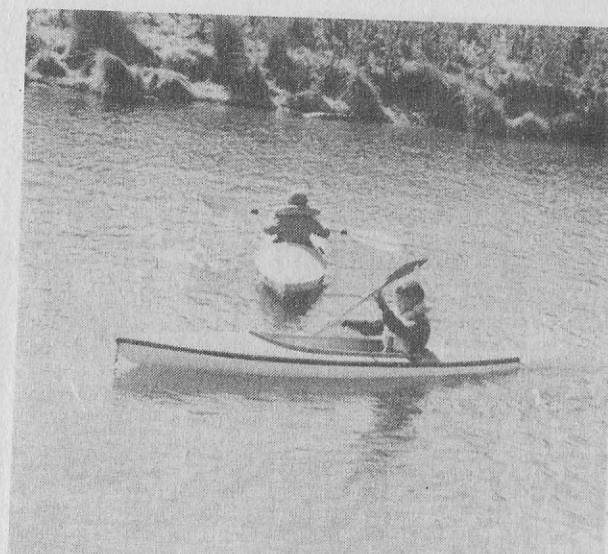

The Sushikai Club from New Plymouth held a Winter Camp at Huinga recently and we arrived in time to photograph students in water training.



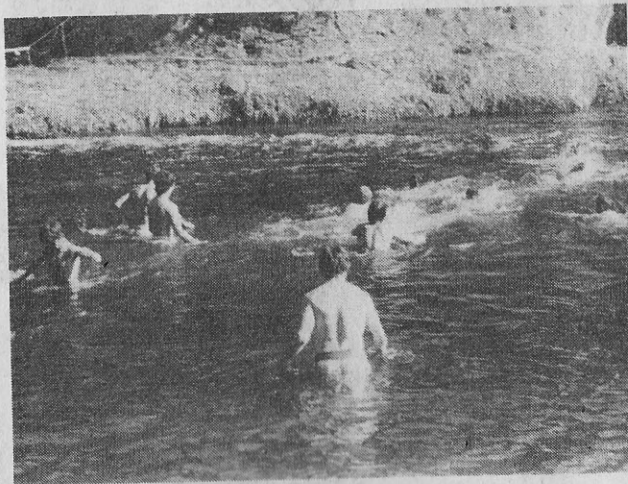

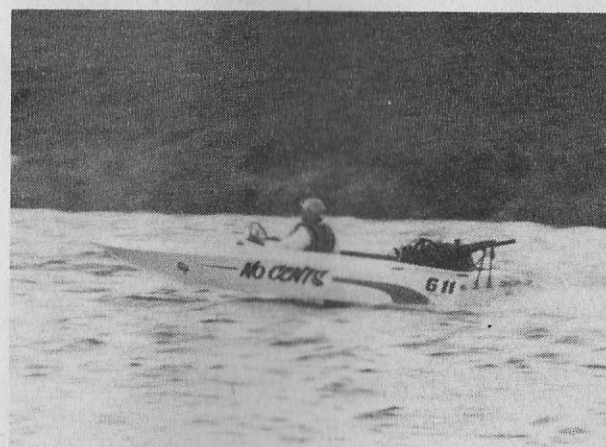

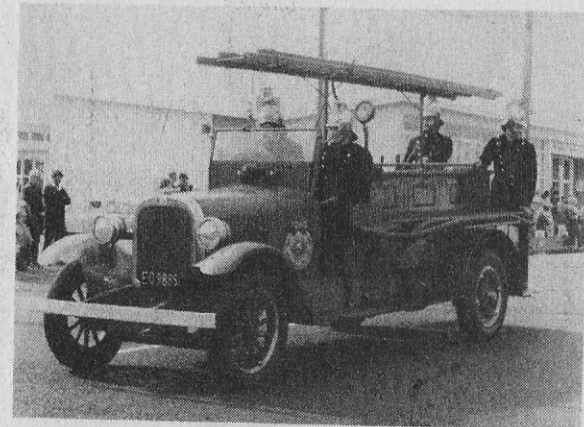

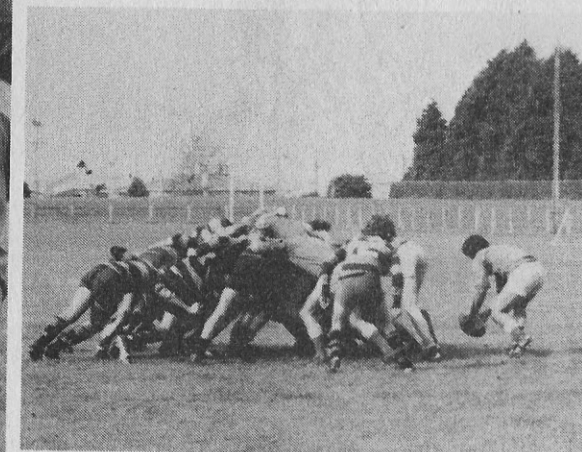

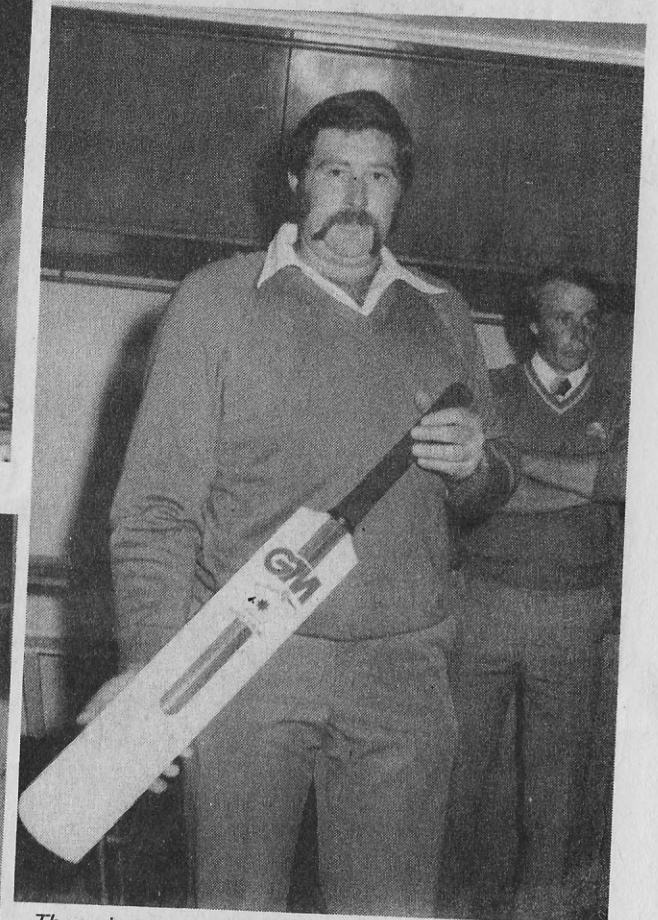

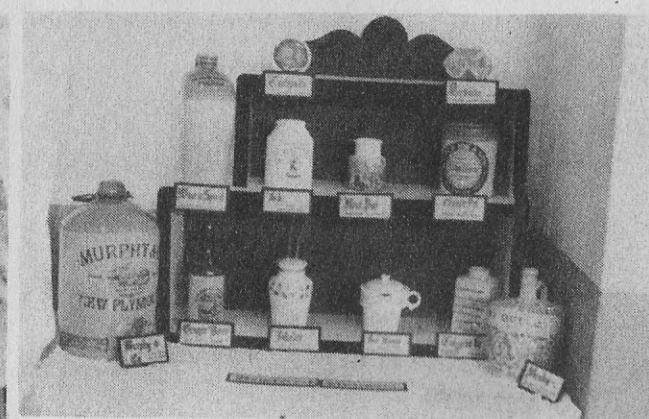

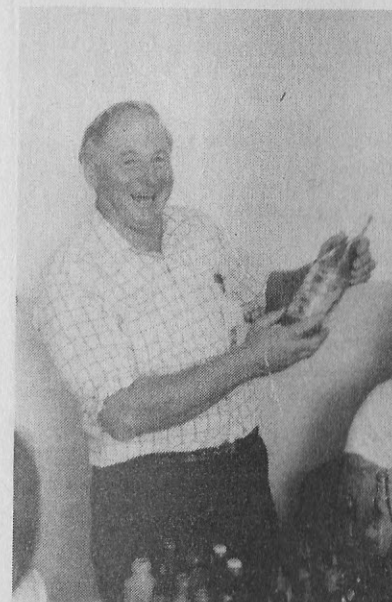

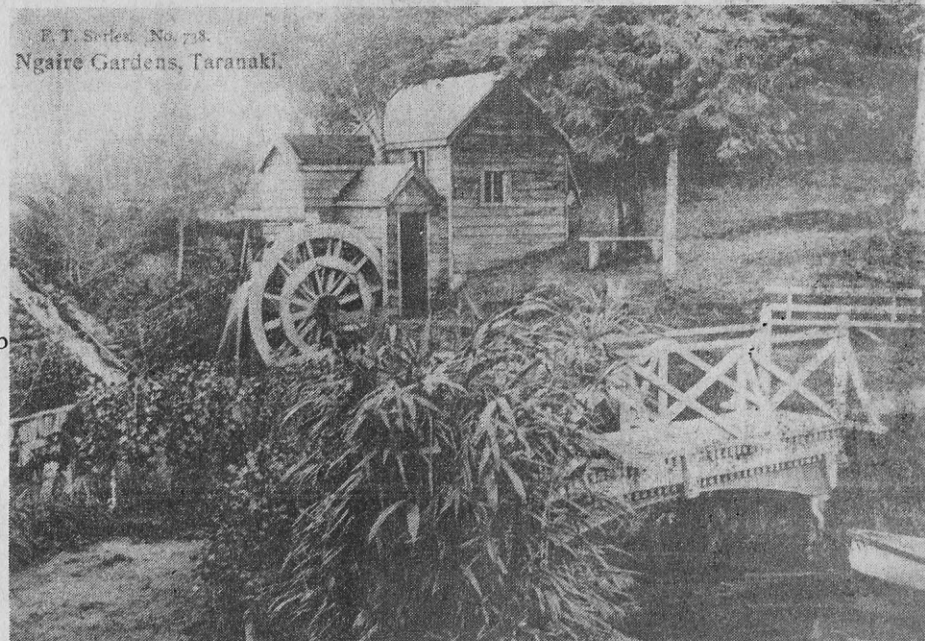

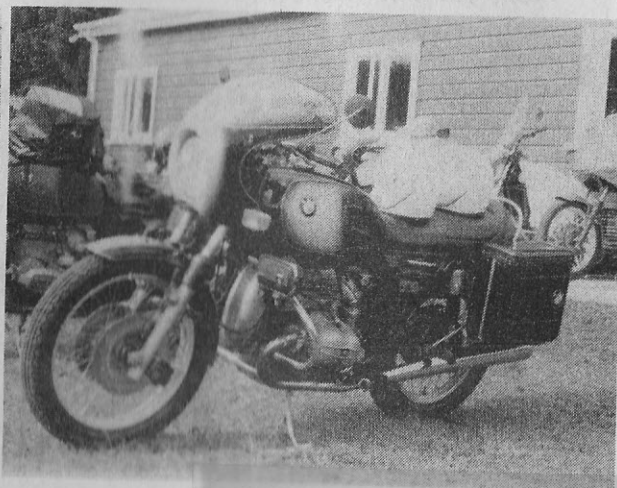

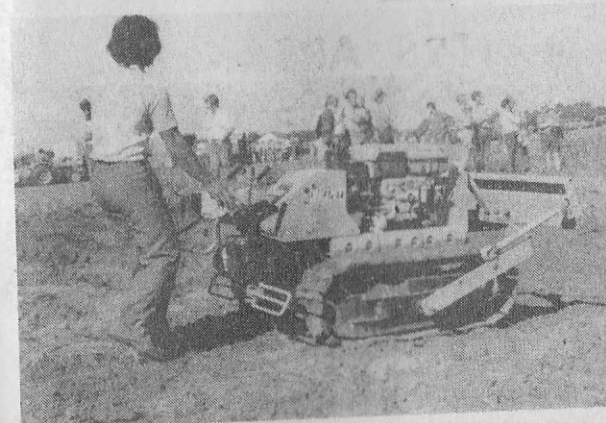

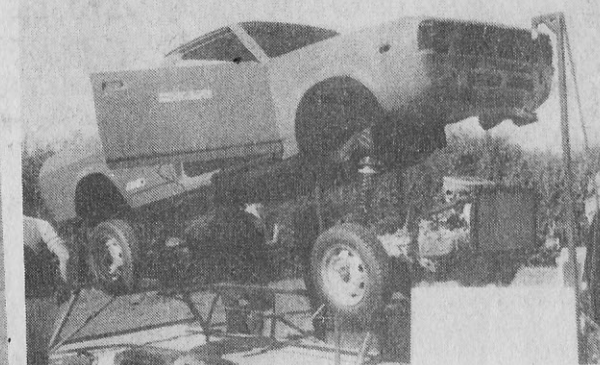

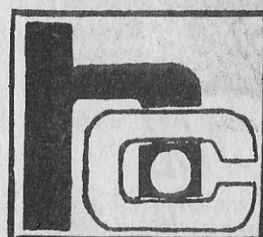

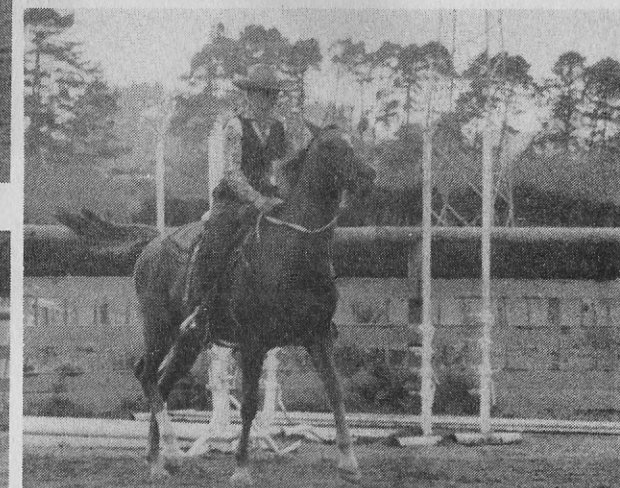

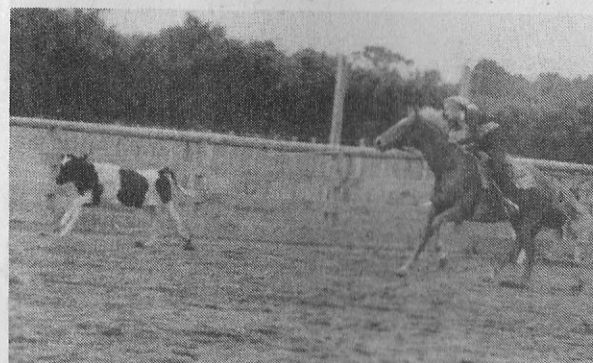

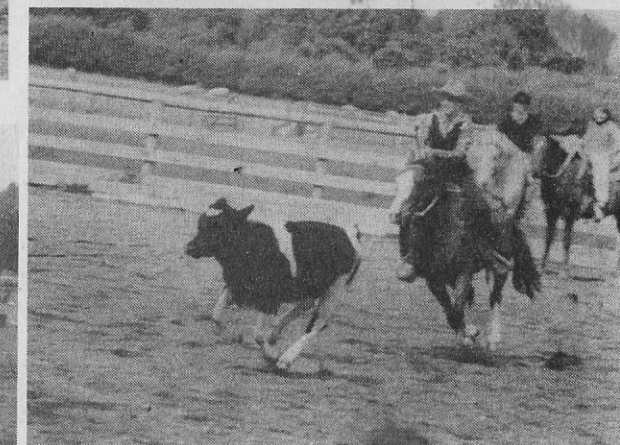

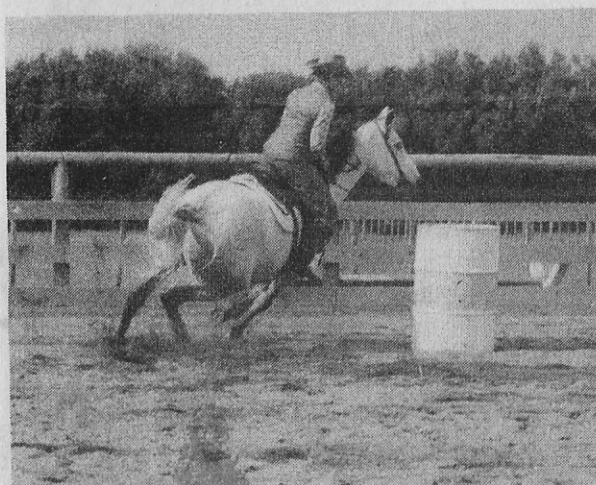

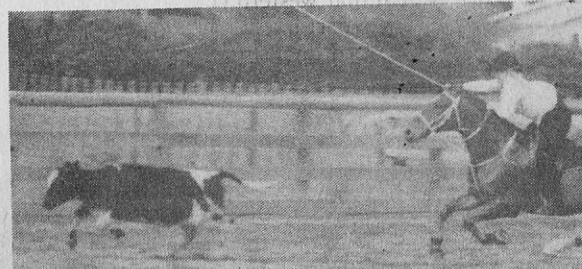

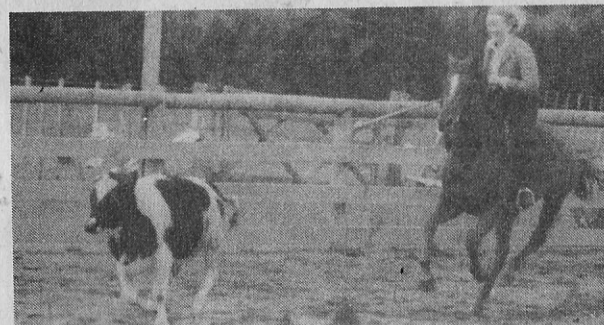

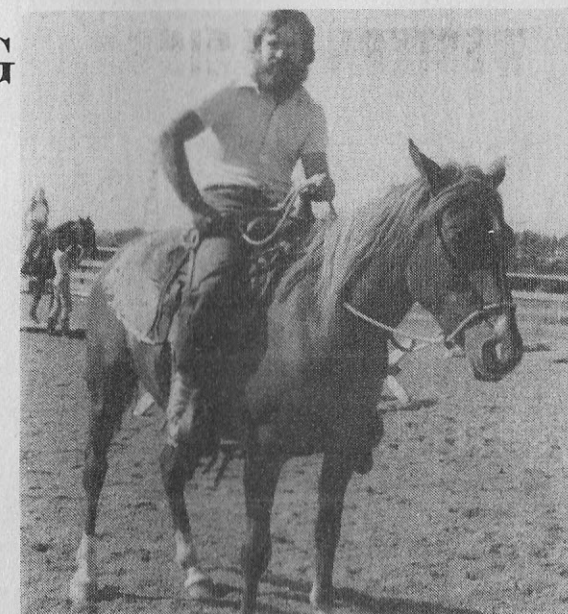

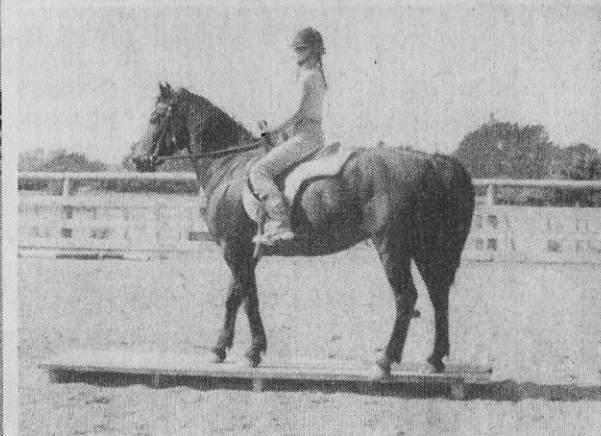

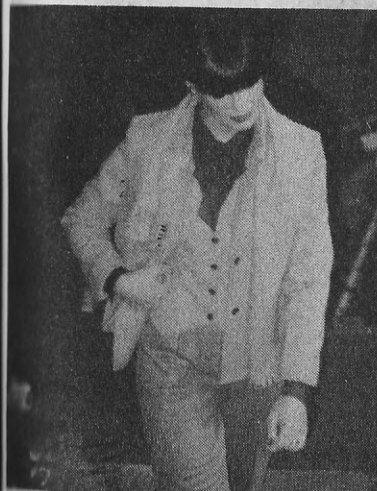

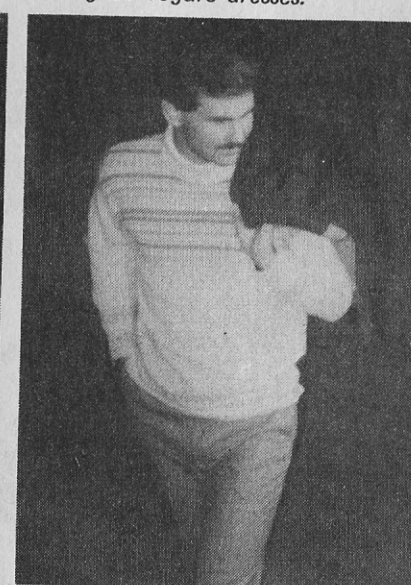

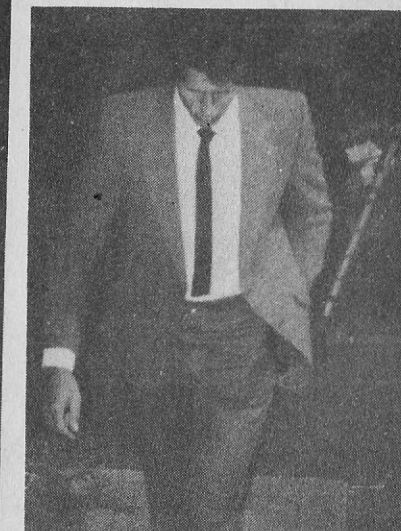

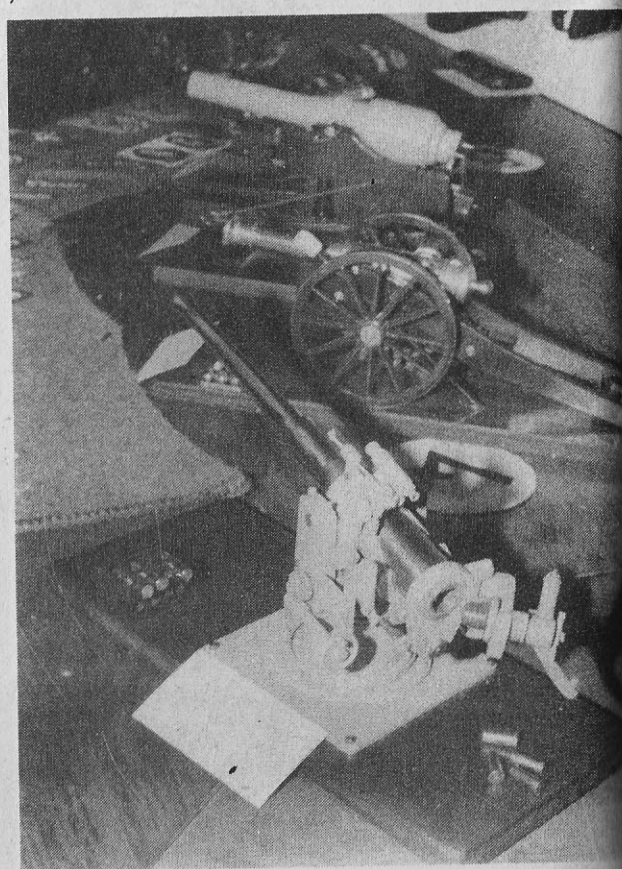

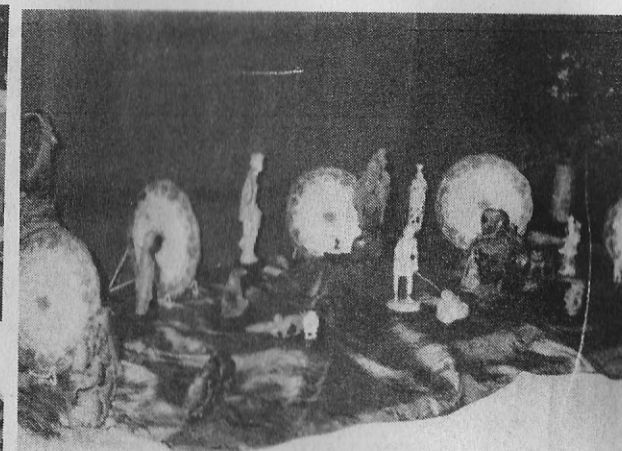

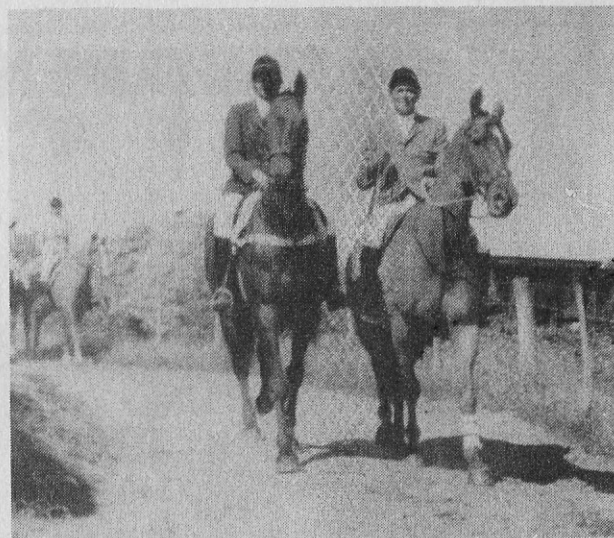
